# Vaccinations help keep your employees healthy

Vaccinations are a simple way to protect your employees' health and play an important role in preventive care.

A flu vaccination can reduce the risk of flu-related doctor visits by 40 to 60%. COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective at protecting against severe illness.

Help your employees get vaccinated quickly and conveniently with an on-site vaccination clinic.



## How an on-site vaccination clinic works

- Contact and schedule a clinic with a vendor listed on the back of this flyer.
- Choose a national vendor for employees outside your state.
- Flu and COVID-19 vaccinations are covered at no cost for employees and covered dependents.
- You can even arrange vaccinations for employees and dependents who aren't Regence members.
- Some vendors also offer other routine vaccinations.

## Frequently asked questions

### How can I be sure my plan covers a vaccination clinic?

Our standard contracts cover on-site vaccination clinics. Some plans may have a different benefit. Call Customer Service at 1-888-367-2116 to confirm that your plan covers a clinic.

### What if my employees get a flu, COVID-19 or other vaccination on their own?

If an employee gets vaccinated by an in-network provider, it will be covered at no out-of-pocket cost. If they use an out-of-network provider, they may have to pay for their vaccination. To be reimbursed, they'll need to submit a claim

with an itemized receipt by signing in to [regence.com](https://regence.com). Their deductible or copay may apply. For COVID-19 vaccinations, the dispensing provider will bill all cost-shares to Regence. Members won't have out-of-pocket costs.

### Will a flu vaccine protect against COVID-19?

No. Getting a flu vaccine will not protect against COVID-19. Vaccination, including keeping up to date on boosters, is recommended by the CDC for preventing serious illness from COVID-19. It's safe to receive flu and COVID-19 vaccinations at the same time. Members should check with their doctor or pharmacist about when to get vaccinated.
